### **Green Hill Park Equestrian Center - February 8 Meeting Report**

1. GHPEC received an \$800 donation from SWVADA (proceeds from their Silent Auction).
2. Make sure show managers clean the bathrooms after each horse show.
3. A new lock for the gate is needed; the old one is sticking too much. Should be in use by the March 31 show.
4. The fencing and low spot around/in Ring 2 should be fixed by the March 31 show as well.
5. The 5th barn is still due. Its arrival has been delayed by the weather.
6. The committee is working on getting a water line installed to the barns, with several spigots in the barn area.
7. GHPEC will be in use (most, if not all, of the rings) on April 22 for a Pony Club regional prep clinic.
8. Mark Courtright reported that VDOT is finally moving on the creation of the new trailer entrance to the park. Should be completed by the end of March. Members should receive notification when it is done. Cars will continue on to the old entrance, but trailers are to use the new entrance, which will be before the old entrance.

Next Meeting: April 10 at 7pm.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm and the February minutes were approved.

Treasurer: Ellen said the treasury will be switched to D.C. McBroom at some point over the next few weeks.

GHPEC: The last barn is in. There is a GHPEC Workday on Friday, April 20th, 5-8 pm, in which jump painting will take place. It is also a cook-out so plan to bring a side dish or dessert. Hot dogs will be provided by GHPEC.

Membership: About 12 new members joined since last month. Membership totals around 70 currently. Linda will try to bring the total number of members and free members to the next meeting.

Equipment: Dana will be working on the equipment room at GHPEC on March 19 if anyone would like to come help. The Spring Workday will be held Saturday, April 14, from 10-2, and members are encouraged to bring equipment such as chainsaws, weed eaters, etc as they will be working on the XC course in preparation for the May 5 Horse Trials. Simple Springs Farm is donating paint and jump numbers. Also, they have a dressage arena for sale. The Board agreed to let them advertise in the newsletter in return for the donation.

Newsletter: Elyse is adding new emails to the list and everything will come out in .pdf format next time with a link for a free Acrobat download for those who need it.

Points: The Points Validation form needs to be updated to contain Kim Smith's information and included in the newsletter.

Education: Susan Icove is currently working to schedule Harriet Peterson for a lesson day at GHPEC and possibly doing this as an ongoing thing if there is enough interest. It is \$65/private lesson and cheaper for semi-private. It will be limited to BREA members only for insurance reasons. A committee was formed for the Adult Camp: Mary Kenny, Sue Jellum, Kim Smith, and Susan Icove.

Young Riders: no report

Southern States Labels: Linda said keep them coming!

Horse Shows: Jen has contracts back from all 4 judges. Billie reported that Bastian's BBQ is secured for all the 2007 show dates. Billie will call a week before to confirm with Bastian's. Ribbons are ordered. There are plenty of eventing tests and Ellen is working on getting the new USEF and USDF dressage tests at no cost to BREA. Ellen will email Elyse copies of the prize lists to be included in the next newsletter.

For the May 5 Horse Trials:

Linda is in charge of the dressage and will use a conversion ring along with securing a scribe and ring steward. The ring steward will man the gate and do a bit/spur check upon competitors entering the ring. Alicia is in charge of Stadium- getting the course designed and set up, finding a stadium judge and scribe, jump crew and take-down. Bernard is in charge of XC and plans to make a general plea for jump judges. He is planning to use 3-5 spotters and the honor system. He has delivered a big log and has some jumps under construction at home. He will also set up the finish line/scorer

Teams: Jen will be emailing out selection criteria. The ATCs are August 25-26 in Tryon, NC, and Mid-South is October 17-21 in Lexington, KY. BREA is hoping to send Novice, Training and Preliminary teams to both.

Green Dressage Test: It had been previously brought up by Kim

Smith to possibly change the Green dressage test to one which included canter. Ellen researched what other shows do and found they offer a Green division and Advanced Green division (this one with a w/t/c test). The Board decided to leave the test the same for Green with an Intro test (no canter).

GHPEC: Ellen noted SWVADA's recent donation to GHPEC and encouraged BREa Board to consider this in the future. Water lines are planned for the new barns and a 5th barn is coming when the weather allows delivery. VDOT is moving the entrance to the park for trailers,

which will make it more readily accessible for larger trailers. Members will be notified when this occurs. There is a new lock coming as well. Green Hill will be in use Sun, April 22 for a regional PC prep clinic.

### Green Hill Park Equestrian Center Stall Rental Information

Stabling is now available at the GHPEC!! Twenty stalls are now on site. This document outlines how BREA will handle rental of these stalls for our horse shows.

Stall Rental Fee: \$10 fee + \$10 refundable deposit (refunded when your stall is confirmed clean when you leave)

Stalls will rent on a first come, first served basis. Competitors are responsible for cleaning their own stalls. Contact the show secretary ahead of time to reserve your stall. When you arrive at the show grounds and pick up your packet, you will be given a stabling ticket. Give the stabling ticket to the Stabling Manager, who will unlock your stall for you. At the end of the day, when you have vacated and cleaned your stall, show the stall to the Stabling Manager. He/she will confirm that your stall is clean and give your ticket back to you and lock the stall. Take your ticket to the show secretary and he/she will refund your \$10 deposit.

Stall Cleaning: Competitors are discouraged from using any bedding in the stalls. All manure and waste is to be put in the trailer or dumpster that is on site.

Stall Features: Stalls are equipped with hooks and competitors are responsible for bringing their own buckets, etc. There is no electricity or running water at the stables. The park plans to have water lines run to the site later this year.

Overnight Stabling: Currently, this is not permitted. It is potentially available on an individual show basis. Contact the show secretary for more information.
