**INSURING YOUR EQUINE ACTIVITIES: OVERVIEW OF THE TYPES OF POLICIES AVAILABLE**

Last month's article talked about the limited liability protection provided by Virginia's Equine Limited Liability statutes. As promised, this month's article provides a general overview of the types of policies that are available for people involved in the equine industry. Before getting further in this discussion, if you have specific questions concerning the purchase of insurance coverage, the best person to talk to is an insurance agent who deals in providing policies that cover equine related activities.

There are several different types of insurance coverage available to people involved in the horse industry. First, let's review the types of policies that equine businesses and equine professionals may consider purchasing. (1) A commercial general equine liability policy is the general coverage policy that boarding, training, and lesson facilities purchase to cover the everyday activities that occur on their premises. It is important to note that this type of policy does not provide worker's compensation coverage and these policies generally do not provide coverage for injury to personal property - i.e. injury to a horse while that horse is on the premises. (2) A care, custody, and control policy can be purchased separately to provide coverage in the case that a horse is injured while on the business' premises or in a professional's care. (3) A professional liability policy (also known as an independent instructor/trainer policy) can be purchased by "travelling professionals" (professionals that teach at multiple farms or locations, or professionals that teach at one farm/location but do not have coverage under the farm's insurance policy) to cover their business activities. In addition to this type of insurance, independent professionals can also purchase care, custody, and control insurance if the professionals trains, hauls, or otherwise cares for horses owned by someone else. (4) Worker's compensation insurance should be purchased by equine businesses that have employee. This type of insurance provides coverage if an employee is injured on the business' premises and while performing work duties. (5) There are also insurance policies that event/show sponsors and organizers can purchase to obtain coverage for their shows, clinics, and other activities.

Is insurance coverage available just for equine professionals and equine businesses? No, there are some insurance policies that a non-professional horse owner may be interested in purchasing. (1) A homeowner's or renter's insurance policy may provide coverage if someone is injured while on your property or if a horse escapes from its field, runs into traffic, and causes an accident. It is very important to note that this type of insurance policy does not cover injuries or damages resulting from a business activity. It is also important that you let your insurance agent know that you have horses on your property (to avoid a denial of coverage down the road). (2) A horse owner who boards her horse at a boarding facility can also purchase an individual horse owner's liability policy to cover for any damages that her horse may cause while she is engaging in an equine activity (i.e. if the owner trail rides her horse over property owned by someone other than the boarding facility or herself and the horse somehow causes damage to that property). (3) An equine health insurance policy can be purchased by any horse owner to help cover the cost of necessary surgeries and/or major medical diagnoses and treatment. (4) An equine mortality policy can be purchased to receive a payout in the event that a horse dies (or if there is "loss of use" or theft of the horse if the policy provides coverage under those circumstances).

For all insurance policies, it is very important that you read the policy thoroughly so that you know what to do, and when to do it, in the event that an incident triggers the insurance policy. The policy will also explain what you should not do - in other words, what types of things will void your insurance coverage.

Next month's article will address the question of why purchasing liability coverage is something that should be carefully considered even though Virginia provides significant statutory protection against liability for injuries sustained while a person is involved in an equine activity.

### Directions to GHPEC:

Exit 137 off I-81. Turn right towards Salem on Wildwood Road. At intersection with Route 11/460, turn right. Go through two lights. At third light, turn left onto Duiduids Lane. Cross RR tracks and pass first entrance to Green Hill Park. Go another mile to the Equestrian Center trailer entrance on your right.

### Other information: (PLEASE READ!!)

*Late entries MAY be accepted and a \$10 late fee charged, at the Show Secretary's discretion.* Starting times will be emailed to competitors and available by phone on the Thursday before the show. Times will also be posted on [www.breventing.org](http://www.breventing.org). *At all horse trials, riders will ride their stadium round & then report immediately to cross country, thus riders should ride their stadium round in cross country attire.* Scratches prior to closing date will receive a full refund less a \$10 office fee. **After closing date, NO refunds will be given.** All dogs MUST be leashed. Contact secretary for concessions availability. Dress is casual, but neat and tidy. Half chaps are allowed. Body protective vests are required for cross country. ASTM-approved helmets *and medical armbands* must be worn when jumping. Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup> place. Divisions will be divided by Junior/Senior, unless there are 2 or fewer in a division. If no age is stated on the entry form, it will be assumed that the rider is a Senior competitor (over 18). Show management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes as entries warrant. USEF rules will be followed unless otherwise noted by show management.

Va. Code, § 3.2-6200.
